

UEFA EURO 2016™ ACCREDITATION TERMS AND CONDITIONS

The following terms and conditions (the "Terms and Conditions") govern (i) the accreditation request process and use conditions applicable to media representatives and other persons who, due to their working function, wish to request and may be granted an Accreditation for the purpose of accessing the Venue(s), Zone(s) during UEFA EURO 2016™ in France and (ii) Accredited Person's attendance at the Venue(s).

Definitions

In these Terms and Conditions, the following words and expressions shall have the following meanings:

Accreditation	an accreditation pass and/or additional access device held by the Accredited Person which (subject to the Terms and Conditions) grants the Accredited Person access to the working areas within one or more Zone(s), at one or more Venue(s) as indicated on such accreditation.
Accreditation Centre(s)	the facilities where approved Accreditation is delivered to the Accredited Person.
Accreditation Coordinator	a UEFA EURO 2016™ organiser's representative responsible for monitoring the accreditation process of given Target Groups, in liaison with the relevant Group Relations Coordinator.
Accredited Person	any Applicant whose Accreditation Request has been accepted by UEFA in accordance with the Terms and Conditions.
Accreditation Portal	a dedicated section of the F.A.M.E. – Football Administration and Management Environment, being an integrated platform owned and managed by UEFA designed to handle all UEFA football management and administration needs, on which the Accreditation Request Form can be completed and Accreditation Request submitted.
Accreditation Request	the accreditation request placed on the Accreditation Portal by an Applicant personally or by a company/organisation representative (Accreditation CFOU) who submits such request on behalf of an Applicant or group of Applicants in accordance with the Terms and Conditions.
Accreditation Request Form	the electronic form filled-in and submitted by an Applicant online via the Accreditation Portal in order to make an Accreditation Request.
Applicant	a natural person who, due to her/his function, may request accreditation for the UEFA EURO 2016™ either personally or by a company/organisation representative (Accreditation CFOU) who submits such request on behalf of an Applicant or group of Applicants in accordance with the Terms and Conditions.
Accreditation CFOU	a person responsible for the Accreditation Application of a group of persons who submits Accreditation Request(s) on behalf of an Applicant or group of Applicants in accordance with the Terms and Conditions.
EURO 2016 SAS	the company held by both UEFA and the FFF, being a simplified joint-stock company ("société par actions simplifiée") with a capital of € 50'000, registered under n°531 326 080 R.C.S in Paris, V.A.T identification number FR 47531326080 and with registered office at 112 avenue Kléber – CS 81671, 75773 Paris CEDEX 16, France – Tel: +33 (0) 825 06 2016, which

supports UEFA in the accreditation request process and is referred to in the Privacy Policy.

FFF the Fédération Française de Football, with its registered office at 87, Boulevard de Grenelle, 75738 Paris Cedex 15, France, which has been appointed by UEFA as the host association for UEFA EURO 2016™.

International Broadcast Centre the UEFA EURO 2016™ international broadcast centre facilities located at in Paris Expo - Porte de Versailles (1 Place de la Porte de Versailles 75015 Paris, France) which require an Accreditation to gain access to.

Match any official football match to be played as part of UEFA EURO 2016™, including any delayed, postponed match, extra-time (if any) and penalty shootouts (if any), as well as pre- and post-match events and activities in the same Stadium.

Privacy Policy the UEFA EURO 2016™ Accreditation Personal Data Privacy Policy will be sent to each Applicant through an email link upon registration. UEFA EURO 2016™ Accreditation Personal Data Privacy Policy is also accessible via the company/organisation representative (Accreditation CFOU) who submitted the Accreditation Requests on behalf of the Applicant who can retrieve them at the following link: <https://uefa.fame.uefa.com/Repository/General/43/5/0/0/2/1/5/6/0/30.pdf>

Stadium the entire premises of any of the official UEFA EURO 2016™ stadiums at which any Match will be played, including all areas which require an Accreditation to gain access to. The official UEFA EURO 2016™ stadiums include:

- Stade de Bordeaux in Bordeaux;
- Stade Bollaert-Delelis in Lens Agglomération;
- Stade Pierre Mauroy in Lille Métropole;
- Stade de Lyon in Lyon;
- Stade Vélodrome in Marseille;
- Stade de Nice in Nice;
- Parc des Princes in Paris;
- Stade de France in Saint-Denis;
- Stade Geoffroy Guichard in Saint-Etienne;
- Stade Municipal de Toulouse in Toulouse.

Target Group a group of persons who, due to the similarity of the functions they perform for UEFA EURO 2016™, belong to the same accreditation category and/or subcategory.

Terms and Conditions these UEFA EURO 2016™ Accreditation Terms and Conditions will be sent to each Applicant through an email link upon registration.

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UEFA	Union des Associations Européennes de Football, whose offices are located at Route de Genève 46, 1260 Nyon 2, Switzerland and any wholly owned subsidiary thereof, including UEFA Events SA.
UEFA EURO 2016™	the final tournament of the UEFA European Football Championship™ 2014-16 which is currently scheduled to be staged in France from 10 June 2016 until 10 July 2016, and for which UEFA holds the relating rights of exploitation under the terms of French Law.
Venue	any of the UEFA EURO 2016™ venues, facilities, locations and/or areas under the control of UEFA, EURO 2016 SAS and/or FFF, which require an Accreditation to gain access to, including the Stadiums and the International Broadcast Centre.
Zone	a pre-defined space/area within a Venue where access is limited to those holding the applicable Accreditation.

Accreditation Requests

1. Accreditation Requests are submitted via the Accreditation Portal. Accreditation Request Form is completed on the Accreditation Portal personally by the Applicant or by a company/organisation representative (Accreditation CFOU) who submits such request on behalf of an Applicant or group of Applicants. For each Applicant, the following details shall be provided in the Accreditation Request Form: surname(s), first name(s), date of birth, place of birth, nationality, gender, identification document type, number and expiration date; contact e-mail, mobile phone number. In addition, company/organisation, which the Applicant is representing or working for (as applicable considering the reason for submitting the Accreditation Request by such Applicant) shall be indicated in the Accreditation Request Form. Incomplete submissions may not be taken into consideration and may be rejected.
2. If a company/organisation representative (Accreditation CFOU) submits Accreditation Request on behalf of an Applicant or group of Applicants, then she/he shall be fully and unconditionally responsible: (a) for ensuring that each Applicant acknowledges and agrees in writing to comply with these Terms and Conditions; and (b) for providing in the Accreditation Request Form all, fully accurate at all times, personal data of each such person exactly as it is set out in such person's passport and/or national identity document to be used in connection with Article 6 below. In particular, copy of the Terms and Conditions shall be provided to each Applicant for whom the company/organisation representative (Accreditation CFOU) submits the Accreditation Request. UEFA EURO 2016™ organiser's representative(s) is(are) entitled to request at any time the written acceptance of the Terms and Conditions by any of the Applicants and/or Accredited Persons. The company/organisation representative (Accreditation CFOU) shall indemnify, keep indemnified, hold harmless and defend UEFA/EURO 2016 SAS/FFF against any and all claims and/or liabilities, damages, costs and expenses relating to any claim against respectively UEFA/EURO 2016 SAS/FFF arising out of the breach of this Article 2. UEFA, EURO 2016 SAS and FFF disclaim any responsibility in this respect. In addition, if the company/organisation representative (Accreditation CFOU) fails to provide the UEFA EURO 2016™ organiser's representative(s) with such written confirmation, the Accreditation Request may be rejected and/or the Accreditation cancelled with immediate effect in accordance with Article 3.
3. Upon receipt of the Accreditation Request, UEFA's representative(s) will review it to confirm that it contains all Applicant mandatory data required under Article 1 and that the Applicant has a working role for the UEFA EURO 2016™ in the Venue(s), Zone(s) coherent with her/his Accreditation Request. Subsequently, it will refer the Applicant's Accreditation Request to FFF for customary security screening by the relevant national authorities.

UEFA, at its sole discretion, reserves the right to reject any request for Accreditation for safety and security reasons in particular due to the outcome of the security screening or in case the request otherwise does not fulfil the requirements stated in the Terms and Conditions or Privacy Policy.

4. If the Accreditation Request is accepted, an SMS confirmation message and a confirmation email will be submitted to the mobile phone number and email address of the Applicant provided in the Accreditation Request Form. Subject to permanent compliance with these Terms and Conditions, the Accredited Person will then be entitled to receive the Accreditation in the Accreditation Centre.
5. UEFA reserves the right, at any time, to revoke, amend or restrict the Accreditation, limit access granted to such Accredited Person and/or prohibit the Accredited Person completely or partially from entering any Venue, Zone or expel the Accredited Person from such Venue, Zone for any non-compliance or breach of these Terms and Conditions, or for any reason that UEFA considers just or in its best interests. In such circumstances, the Accreditation shall, upon request by UEFA be immediately returned to UEFA (or to a duly authorised person on behalf of UEFA).

Use of the Accreditation and conduct

6. Access to the Venue(s) and the relevant Zone(s) (as indicated on the Accreditation) for each Accredited Person shall be granted solely for working purposes in accordance with the work-related activities of the Accredited Person in the Venue(s), the relevant Zone(s) as per the Accreditation Request and only upon:
(a) acceptance of the Terms and Conditions by the Accredited Person; (b) presentation of a valid Accreditation (which must be clearly displayed by the Accredited Person at all times at the Venue(s), and in the relevant Zone(s)); and (c) upon request, presentation of a valid passport or national identity card with photograph and signature of the Accredited Person.
7. The Accreditation is property of UEFA, it is non-transferable and it may only be used by the Accredited Person (whose name has been registered at the time of the submission of the Accreditation Request). It is strictly prohibited to give away, reproduce, offer for sale or sell Accreditation or any items related thereto.
8. The Accreditation or any other related items may not be used for any kind of commercial purpose such as advertising, promotional, public relation campaigns, social media campaigns etc.
9. Accredited Persons entering the Venue(s) and/or Zone(s): (a) are strictly prohibited from using, possessing or distributing (whether for free or otherwise) any propaganda, discriminatory, political, religious or racist objects and materials; and/or (b) may not offer to sell, sell or possess with intent to sell goods such as food, drinks, souvenirs, clothes, promotional and/or commercial items, unless approved in advance by UEFA in writing.

All such items may be removed or confiscated by stewards and/or any other duly authorised persons at the Venue(s), within the Zone(s).

10. Accredited Persons shall observe and comply with all reasonable rules, regulations, directions, instructions, guidelines and conditions relating to safety and security at the Match(es) and in the Venue(s) (as displayed therein), including all instructions of stewards, safety personnel and/or any other duly authorised persons representing the UEFA EURO 2016™ or any competent authorities.
11. Accredited Persons are responsible for their Accreditation and shall indemnify and hold UEFA, EURO 2016 SAS, the FFF and/or the Venue owner(s) and/or operator(s) harmless from and against all damages and liabilities suffered or incurred in connection with, resulting from or arising out of their misuse or improper use of the Accreditation and/or any breach of the Terms and Conditions.

Intellectual Property Rights & Sound and Image Recordings

12. Any and all rights in or relating to UEFA EURO 2016™ and/or any official related events are owned by UEFA and may not be used without UEFA's prior written authorisation.
13. It is strictly forbidden at any time (in particular before, during or after the Match(es)) to:

- (a) record, use and/or transmit any sound, image and/or description of the Venues, the Zone(s), the Match(es) (including any results, statistics, information and/or other data) for any commercial purpose other than solely for editorial news reporting purposes in permitted publications (as defined in Appendix 1) without the prior written approval of UEFA; and/or
 - (b) transmit any still and/or moving images of the Venue(s), the Zone(s) and/or the Match(es) for any purposes without the prior written approval of UEFA. No such materials may be formatted for viewing on any mobile devices (such as mobile telephones, PDAs, tablets etc.) or on any online site(s) or platform(s) including Internet site(s) and social platform(s) other than in accordance with Article 15 below.
14. Any transmission (whether audio, visual or audio-visual) from or of the Match(es) and/or the Venue(s) via Internet, fixed or wireless technology, or the sale or distribution of any commentary of the Match(es) on any media, is expressly prohibited at any time unless specifically authorised by UEFA.
 15. Subject to Article 13, only photographs taken by officially accredited photographers may be published in permitted publications via the Internet, mobile or via "Apps" (as defined in Appendix 1) as long as they appear as still images and not as moving pictures, quasi-video streaming or slide shows. Notwithstanding the foregoing, in respect of the Match(es), photographs published in online permitted publications (whether via the Internet or otherwise) shall have an interval of at least 20 seconds between the posting of each such photograph.
 16. No contradictory provisions under existing licences or agreements with third parties will be recognised in relation to the UEFA EURO 2016™ and/or the Match(es) unless approved in advance by UEFA.
 17. Any use of the trade marks, logos and marks associated with UEFA, UEFA EURO 2016™ and/or the Match(es) (either by the Accredited Persons themselves or through/by any third party) may only be made strictly in accordance with the guidelines and/or instructions given by UEFA or in other case with the express prior written approval of UEFA. No person shall engage (either by themselves or through any third party) in any marketing, promotions or any other activities associated with UEFA, UEFA EURO 2016™ and/or the Match(es) or create and/or use any materials for such purposes, without the prior written approval of UEFA.
 18. Accredited Persons entering the Venue(s) and/or attending the Match(es), consent to being photographed, filmed or taped by UEFA and/or any third parties permitted by UEFA, which shall have the right to use, broadcast, publish and license, without any requirement for payment of money or other form of consideration, of Accredited Persons, image and likeness by means of live or recorded video and/or audio display, broadcast or other transmission or recording, photographs or any other current and/or future media technologies. Accredited Person acknowledges and agrees that she/he has been informed that such photographs or video/audio recordings can be processed by UEFA as personal data, in accordance with but not limited to Articles 19 to 23 of these Terms and Conditions.

Personal Data

19. In the course of the Accreditation Request process, UEFA collects certain personal identifying information, defined under Article 1. The personal data provided in the Accreditation Request Form is necessary to make and handle the Accreditation Request. This information is registered and kept in a specific database managed by UEFA.
20. UEFA commits to protect such personal data and to comply with data privacy and security laws in support of its business processes in order to ensure adequate protection of Applicants personal rights.
21. In particular, UEFA undertakes to process personal data in accordance with these Terms and Conditions, the Swiss Federal Act on Data Protection of 19 June 1992, its Ordinance and any other applicable local legislation and to define and implement the appropriate technical and organisational measures necessary to maintain the security of personal data, according to the nature of the personal data processed and the circumstances of the processing, with the objective of avoiding (in the realm of the possible and having regard to the state of the art) non-authorized or unlawful processing or access (Confidentiality), its alteration (Integrity) and/or loss (Availability).

By submitting an Accreditation Request and approving the Terms and Conditions, Applicants (and/or the persons referred to in Article 2 on behalf of the Applicant) expressly agree to the use of personal data in accordance with the Privacy Policy and consent to and permit:

- (a) the processing of personal data related to Applicants by UEFA for the purpose of: organisation or administration of the Accreditation Request process;
 - (b) the processing of personal data related to Applicants by UEFA for the purpose of issuing Accreditation, carrying out any access check procedures or any other necessary security screening; and
 - (c) possible disclosure of such personal data by UEFA to its subsidiaries and third parties in connection with such purposes.
22. In particular, by approving the Terms and Conditions, Applicants expressly permit and agree to the disclosure of their personal data by UEFA to third parties when:
- (a) UEFA needs to send the information to the police/state authorities to carry out security controls at the Venue(s) and/or Matches for which the Applicants have requested access to;
 - (b) UEFA needs to send the information to third parties who work on behalf of or for UEFA to provide a product or service the Applicants have requested (unless otherwise stated so, these third parties are prohibited to use the personal identifying information UEFA provides to them beyond what is necessary to provide the product or service to the Applicants);
 - (c) UEFA needs to comply with court or authority orders;
 - (d) UEFA finds that it is necessary, as determined in UEFA's sole discretion, to investigate, prevent or take action regarding illegal activities, suspected fraud, emergency situations involving potential threats to the physical safety of any persons, violations to the Terms and Conditions or as otherwise required by law.
23. Before disclosing the Applicants' personal data to third parties, UEFA will ensure that sufficient security measures and adequate data protection are guaranteed by the third party and take reasonable steps to ensure compliance with those measures. In particular, UEFA ensures that an adequate protection is guaranteed for personal data to be transferred abroad. In some specific cases when this level of protection is not guaranteed, UEFA will obtain the Applicants' prior consent or establish with the recipient of personal data a contractual framework or sufficient safeguards that ensure an adequate level of protection abroad. As part of its internal data auditing process, UEFA will conduct regular checks on processing by third parties, especially with respect to security measures.

Miscellaneous

24. In the event that an Accredited Person misplaces or loses the Accreditation, UEFA shall decide in its sole discretion whether to replace such Accreditation, at cost (€150).
25. The Terms and Conditions are drafted in the French and English languages. If translated into any other language, then the French language text shall prevail.
26. The Terms and Conditions are available at any time on the Accreditation Portal at the following link: <https://uefa.fame.uefa.com/Repository/General/43/5/0/0/2/1/5/5/9/30.pdf> and may be revised from time to time. Notice of significant revisions will be communicated for acceptance in accordance with the contact details provided in the Application Form.
27. The Terms and Conditions shall be governed by and interpreted in accordance with the substantive laws of Switzerland. All disputes arising from or related to the Terms and Conditions shall be submitted to the courts of Paris, France. UEFA reserves the right to pursue any legal proceedings in the competent courts at the defendant's domicile.

I confirm that I have read and understood and I agree to be bound by these Terms and Conditions in accordance with the rights granted to me by means of my Accreditation. Moreover, I agree to be responsible for ensuring that any of the Applicants (if any) for whom I applied for Accreditation are aware of and agrees to comply with these Terms and Conditions and have accepted them in writing prior to any application process request.

Appendix 1

Permitted Publications for the UEFA EURO 2016™

Print

1. An ordinary edition of any newspaper and/or any special supplement (not sold separately) to any such newspaper provided that it is of no larger dimensions than the newspaper to which it is a supplement and that it is not based solely on UEFA EURO 2016™, any team, any player(s) and/or any Match that any team has played or will play.
2. A special edition of a newspaper (as set out in paragraph 1 of this Appendix 1) being an issue of such a newspaper specific to any locality where content relating to UEFA EURO 2016™ and/or a Match is incorporated into the general content of the newspaper.
3. A magazine or periodical publication produced at regular intervals and not devoted solely to any team, any player(s) and/or any Match that any team has played or will play and/or devoted solely to UEFA EURO 2016™.
4. A book not devoted solely to UEFA EURO 2016™, any team, any player(s) and/or any Match that any team has played or will play.

Online

5. In respect of any of the permitted publications set out in paragraphs 1 to 4 of this Appendix 1:
 - an online Internet equivalent;
 - a mobile device formatted equivalent; and
 - an "app" equivalent. "App" here refers to downloaded applications installed and used on mobile computing devices (e.g. tablets and smartphones) such as, but not limited to, those available from the App Store and Android Market.
6. An Internet site that provides bona fide reporting services equivalent to those provided by the publications set out in paragraphs 1 to 4 of this Appendix 1 but not devoted solely to any Match, UEFA EURO 2016™ which shall be authorised by UEFA.

Other

7. Advertising, promotional, marketing and point-of-sale materials for any items set out in paragraphs 1 to 4 and 6 of this Appendix 1.
